Whether through desire conflicts, chronic dissatisfaction, affairs, or dysfunctions, sexual issues form a large part of every therapist's practice. This workshop is for clinicians of all backgrounds who wish to better understand and treat their clients' sexual functioning and decision-making.

Participants will learn a compelling new model of sexuality that focuses on its positive aspects; challenges clients' tendencies to self-identify as inadequate; sees society's sex-negativity as a source of psycho-sexual pathology; confronts ways in which therapy can demonize sexuality; and takes existential dilemmas seriously. With plenty of specific case material and time for questions, topics covered include:

- Noticing and challenging clients' assumptions about sexuality & intimacy
- History-taking & home assignments
- Sex, intimacy, romance, love: understanding the differences and connections
- Myths about sexual desire and desire discrepancies
- Issues in sexual orientation and alternative forms of sexual expression
- Dealing with sexual exploitation by empowering clients
- How our sexual values affect our work - and often disempower our clients
- Sexual aspects of health issues, including aging, illness, and medications
